

RS Clubmans Summer Autocross

Saturday 21st, Sunday 22nd August 2021

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. ANNOUNCEMENT - The Green Belt Motor Club will organise two separate one-day Clubman status Autocross's on Saturday 21st and Sunday 22nd August 2021 at Old Park Farm, Perry Green nr Much Hadham, Essex. OS Map Reference 167/443167. This event is being co promoted with Anglia Motor Sport Club.

2. JURISDICTION - The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

3. AUTHORISATION – Motorsport UK Permits: Saturday 121909, Sunday 119447.

4. ELIGIBILITY - The event is open to members of the organising club (including clubs of AMSC), and the following clubs – Anglia Motor Sport Club, Bath MC, Craven MC, Farnborough DMC, North Devon MC, Oxford MC, South Hams MC, South Oxen CC, Torbay MC, Weald Motor Club and Witney MC

5 SIGNING-ON - All competitors must have a valid Motorsport UK RS Clubmans or above Competition Licence and Club Membership Card and produce them when required.

6. CHAMPIONSHIPS – not applicable.

7. EVENT PROGRAMME - The programme for each event will be published in the finals, depending on the number of the entries in the two day Interclub event.

Final Instructions for the event which will be sent to all Entrants/Drivers on Tuesday 17th August 2021 by email unless otherwise requested.

8. COURSE - The length of the course will be approximately 1100 metres on a stubble field. The course will be defined by white marker poles. Competitors are reminded that if all four wheels go off the course (inside or outside) then you must STOP and not proceed until instructed to do so by an Official. See GR N3.7.7. All orange arrows will be penalty markers as defined in N2.4.3. In the event of severe change in field/weather conditions, the organisers reserve the right to amend or move the course.

9. PADDOCK - Competitors **MUST NOT** practice or warm up their engines by driving at speed in the paddock area. Any offence will be reported to the Clerk of the Course and may lead to a penalty of **exclusion**. If any competitors wish to group together in the paddock in order to utilize servicing facilities, this information must be included on their entry forms.

10. FLAGS - Only one flag will be used in addition to the Union and Chequered flags and that is the RED flag. Drivers **MUST** slow down and STOP immediately to await further instructions from the Course Officials.

11. FUEL - To conform to the Health & Safety Regulations, refuelling of cars must be carried out in controlled conditions from an approved fuel container and with a member of the

service/support crew standing by with a primed and ready to use fire extinguisher. There must also be adequate ground cover to prevent spillage onto the ground.

12. Classes: The event will run with the following class structure:

12.1 Vehicle classes are modified from section N4.9 – 4.9.4 of the Motorsport UK 2021 Yearbook which are replaced as follows:

A1 Standard Production up to 1600 cc. Cars MUST comply with the current version of N4.9.3, except for the following which are modified:

Petrol tank is free for modification or relocation; wheel sizes are free; shock absorbers may be uprated but must be of a fixed rate and not adjustable; roll-over bars to K1.6.1 to K1.6.2 are strongly recommended.

A2 As Class A1, but over 1600cc.

B Modified Production Based Cars up to 1400cc.

C As per Class B, over 1400cc up to 1650cc.

D As per Class B, over 1650cc.

Cars in classes B, C and D MUST comply with the current version of N4.10.5, except for the following which are modified: Lightening and space frame construction is allowed; engine must remain in the original engine compartment.

E1 Specials

E2 All Four-Wheel Drive Vehicles

F Junior Autocross (Age 14 to 17) - see GR N4.1 to 4.8 & 4.21.

G1 Stage Rally Cars – 2wd - up to 1600cc – See N4.9.4.

G2 Stage Rally Cars – 2wd - over 1600cc – See N4.9.4.

12.2 All motorcycle-engined vehicles are eligible but will be classified as Specials (E1) and must comply with Motorsport UK General Regulations.

12.3 Competitors in Classes G1 & G2 may request to practice and compete on timed runs alongside cars within these classes, or singularly.

12.4 Single seat 'buggies' and non-centre seated saloons with no windows must be fitted with window nets or arm restraints.

12.5 Diesel-engined cars are eligible to compete in all classes but will not be subject to a 40% capacity loading if fitted with forced induction. Petrol-engined cars fitted with forced induction will have a 40% capacity loading applied.

12.6 Cars powered by hybrid or full electric engines are not eligible for entry into this event.

13. Technical Regulations

- 13.1 All vehicles **MUST** comply with Technical Regulations J, N4.1 to N4.19 and N4.21 to N4.21.14.
- 13.2 Vehicles considered by the Clerk of the Course not to be within the spirit of the regulations for Classes A1 & A2 will not be accepted for entry in these classes.
- 13.3 Tyres are free, to include M&S, but **NOT** block pattern and **NOT** Motocross type pattern. If in doubt, contact the Clerk of the Course.
- 13.4 Seats and harnesses of ALL cars need NOT be in date but MUST be of a good condition
- 13.5 All fire extinguishers must either be less than 2 years old or have been serviced within the previous 2 years and carry a label stating such a service has been carried out.

14. AWARDS

Fastest Time of Event,

1st in class (minimum 4 starters),

2nd in class (minimum 8 starters),

Additional awards may be presented at the organisers' discretion

15. ENTRIES - The entry list opens upon publication of these ASR's. The basic entry fee will be **£75** for each day and the closing date is Wednesday 18th August. **Discounted entries are available up to Friday 6th August (£40 for Juniors, £60 for full members of Green Belt Motor Club and members of Anglia Motor SC, £65 for others).**

- All entries must be made one line via the link from the club's website.
- Payment must be by bank transfer to **Green Belt Motor Club** bank account at sort code **60-07-38**, account number **04331982**, which must have your name plus AX as a reference.
- Once an entry is received the finals and results will be sent to the nominated person via e-mail.

The maximum entry for this event is 40 and the minimum 15. The minimum for each Class is 3. Should any of these minimum figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to either cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt with no exceptions. Entry fees will be refunded in full up to 6th August, thereafter there will be a minimum £10 administration fee.

17. RESULTS - Provisional results of the event will be published as soon as possible after the Sunday final timed runs and made final as soon as possible after that.

18. PROTESTS - Any protest must be lodged in accordance with GR. C5.

19. STARTING ORDER - Cars will start in groups of up to 2 cars simultaneously with the maximum number of 4 cars on the course at any one time. Cars in classes G1 and G2 may only run alongside cars in these classes and can run singularly. The start signal will be by lights or the union flag. The method of timing will be electronic starting on the green light. A chequered flag will denote the finish line.

20. PRACTICE - Competitors will have one practice run consisting of 3 laps.

21. TIMED RUNS - Drivers will have a minimum of 3 timed runs, each of 4 laps duration, time and weather permitting.

22. Numbering:

22.1 Competitors will be identified by competition numbers which will be allocated by the organisers. Competitors are responsible for providing their own numbers as per GR J4.1 and S9.2.5.

22.2 The whole of the number must be clearly displayed on both sides of the car and be either black or white to contrast with the background colour.

22.3 Drivers of double-driven cars must ensure that the correct number is displayed for all practice and event runs. Failure to do so may result in the Motorsport UK Timekeeper not allocating a run time; a re-run will not be given.

23. MARKING & PENALTIES - Will be in accordance with Motorsport UK General Regulation N3.7 to N3.7.7. Penalty Markers will be orange arrows on stakes pointing down to ground.

24. JUDGES OF FACT - Each track marshal will be a Judge of Fact for circuit penalties. A start line judge will be appointed for false starts.

25. TOILETS - Will be provided on site.

26. LITTER - Please take your litter home with you; we want to use this venue again. Any pets must be kept on leads.

27. Damage to Third Party Property

The Motorsport UK Insurance Policy does not cover any Circuit Damage. Should competitors cause damage to any third party property they will be liable for the full reinstatement cost of any damage caused. Where the damage is covered by the Motorsport UK insurance policy, the competitor will be liable for the insurance excess that Green Belt Motor Club has to pay the Motorsport UK, currently £475.

28. Final instructions, competition number, directions etc., will be forwarded to all competitors by email in the week prior to the meeting.
